

Look upon them with the eyes of your mercy; comfort them with a sense of your goodness; preserve them from temptation; and give them patience within their affliction. In your time and space, fulfill them with health, and enable them to enjoy life in reverence of you, and to your glory. Grant that all who have suffered dwell peacefully with you in life everlasting.

- pause in silence -

For Caretakers:

O God of accompaniment, uphold all those who find that they are expectedly or unexpectedly called as mental health caregivers. Sanctify those medical practitioners whom you have ordained to the study and practice of the arts of healing and the prevention of disease. Relieve the exhaustion of all helpers and strengthen their hearts and hands to channel your life-giving Spirit. By their ministries, may the health of the community be promoted and your creation glorified.

For Communities

O Creator of all life, expand the power of your healing to all communities who work together to transform the effects of chronic mental and emotional illness. May communities be able to hold equally their stories of trauma, cries of despair, and tools for resilience. May collective love temper the struggle of illness. Keep communities bold in their support, strengthened in their weakness, and confident in your loving care through every obstacle, through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

FIRST READING

Acts 11:1-18

In defense of his earlier baptism of non-Jewish believers, Peter demonstrates to the members of the Jerusalem church that God's intention to love Gentiles as well as Jews is revealed in Jesus' testimony. In this way the mission to the Gentiles is officially authorized.

A reading from Acts.

¹ Now the apostles and the brothers and sisters who were in Judea heard that the gentiles had also accepted the word of God. ² So when Peter went up to Jerusalem, the circumcised believers criticized him, ³ saying, "Why did you go to uncircumcised men and eat with them?" ⁴ Then Peter began to explain it to them, step by step, saying, 5 "I was in the city of Joppa praying, and in a trance I saw a vision. There was something like a large sheet coming down from heaven, being lowered by its four corners, and it came close to me. ⁶ As I looked at it closely I saw four-footed animals, beasts of prey, reptiles, and birds of the air. ⁷I also heard a voice saying to me, 'Get up, Peter; kill and eat.' ⁸ But I replied, 'By no means, Lord, for nothing profane or unclean has ever entered my mouth.' ⁹ But a second time the voice answered from heaven, 'What God has made clean, you must not call profane.' 10 This happened three times; then everything was pulled up again to heaven. 11 At that very moment three men, sent to me from Caesarea, arrived at the house where we were. ¹² The Spirit told me to go with them and not to make a distinction between them and us. These six brothers also accompanied me, and we entered the man's house. ¹³ He told us how he had seen the angel standing in his house and saying, 'Send to Joppa and bring Simon, who is called Peter: ¹⁴ he will give you a message by which you and your entire household will be saved.' 15 And as I began to speak, the Holy Spirit fell upon them just as it had upon us at the beginning. ¹⁶ And I remembered the word of the Lord, how he had said, 'John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit.' ¹⁷ If then God gave them the same gift that he gave us when we believed in the Lord Jesus Christ, who was I that I could hinder God?" ¹⁸ When they heard this, they were silenced. And they praised God, saying, "Then God has given even to the gentiles the repentance that leads to life."

John's vision shows us that in the resurrection the new age has dawned; God dwells with us already. Yet we wait for the time when the tears that cloud our vision will be wiped away. Then we will see the new heaven, new earth, and new Jerusalem.

¹ I saw a new heaven and a new earth, for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away, and the sea was no more. ² And I saw the holy city, the new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared as a bride adorned for her husband. ³ And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying,

"See, the home of God is among mortals.

He will dwell with them;

they will be his peoples,

and God himself will be with them and be their God;

⁴he will wipe every tear from their eyes.

Death will be no more;

mourning and crying and pain will be no more,

for the first things have passed away."

⁵ And the one who was seated on the throne said, "See, I am making all things new." Also he said, "Write this, for these words are trustworthy and true." ⁶ Then he said to me, "It is done! I am the Alpha and the Omega, the Beginning and the End. To the thirsty I will give water as a gift from the spring of the water of life."

Empower us to speak up for those who do not have a voice; save us from making peace with the injustices in the social systems that have failed them. Lord, in your mercy, **hear our prayer.**

Guide those who do research for the prevention and treatment of mental illnesses; uphold them with your compassion and diligence. Lord, in your mercy, **hear our prayer.**

For those who are in recovery and for treatments that enable them to return to full and rewarding lives, we give you thanks. Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer.

Creator of life and Merciful Healer, we trust that in your time and way, you will dispel all darkness with your light, all confusion with your order, all fear with your peace. Through Jesus Christ, who intercedes for us and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. **Amen.**
