

FIRST READING

Ecclesiastes 1:2, 12-14; 2:18-23

The teacher of wisdom who wrote Ecclesiastes sees that working for mere accumulation of wealth turns life into an empty game, a "vanity of vanities." Nevertheless, he asserts in the next verse, it is good to find enjoyment in one's work because such enjoyment is a gift from God.

A reading from Ecclesiastes.

² Vanity of vanities, says the Teacher,

vanity of vanities! All is vanity.

¹² I, the Teacher, was king over Israel in Jerusalem. ¹³ I applied my mind to seek and to search out by wisdom all that is done under heaven; it is an unhappy business that God has given to humans to be busy with. ¹⁴ I saw

all the deeds that are done under the sun, and see, all is vanity and a chasing after wind.

^{2:18} I hated all my toil in which I had toiled under the sun, seeing that I must leave it to my successor, ¹⁹ and who knows whether he will be wise or foolish? Yet he will be master of all for which I toiled and used my wisdom under the sun. This also is vanity. ²⁰ So I turned and gave my heart up to despair concerning all the toil of my labors under the sun, ²¹ because sometimes one who has toiled with wisdom and knowledge and skill must leave all to be enjoyed by another who did not toil for it. This also is vanity and a great evil. ²² What do mortals get from all the toil and strain with which they toil under the sun? ²³ For all their days are full of pain, and their work is a vexation; even at night their minds do not rest. This also is vanity.

SECOND READING

Colossians 3:1-11

Life in Christ includes a radical reorientation of our values. Just as the newly baptized shed their old clothes and put on new garments, so Christians are called to let go of greed and take hold of a life shaped by God's love in Christ.

A reading from Colossians.

¹ So if you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. ² Set your minds on the things that are above, not on the things that are on earth, ³ for you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. ⁴ When Christ who is your life is revealed, then you also will be revealed with him in glory.

⁵ Put to death, therefore, whatever in you is earthly: sexual immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, and greed (which is idolatry). ⁶ On account of these the wrath of God is coming on those who are disobedient. ⁷ These are the ways you also once followed, when you were living that life. ⁸ But now you must get rid of all such things: anger, wrath, malice, slander, and abusive language from your mouth. ⁹ Do not lie to one another, seeing that you have stripped off the old self with its practices ¹⁰ and have clothed yourselves with the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge according to the image of its creator. ¹¹ In that renewal there is no longer Greek and Jew, circumcised and uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, enslaved and free, but Christ is all and in all!

In God's reign, the "rich will be sent away empty." Jesus uses a parable to warn against identifying the worth of one's life with the value of one's possessions rather than one's relationship with God.

¹³ Someone in the crowd said to [Jesus,] "Teacher, tell my brother to divide the family inheritance with me." ¹⁴ But he said to him, "Friend, who set me to be a judge or arbitrator over you?" ¹⁵ And he said to them, "Take care! Be on your guard against all kinds of greed, for one's life does not consist in the abundance of possessions." ¹⁶ Then he told them a parable: "The land of a rich man produced abundantly. ¹⁷ And he thought to himself, 'What should I do, for I have no place to store my crops?' ¹⁸ Then he said, 'I will do this: I will pull down my barns and build larger ones, and there I will store all my grain and my goods. ¹⁹ And I will say to my soul, Soul, you have ample goods laid up for many years; relax, eat, drink, be merry.' ²⁰ But God said to him, 'You fool! This very night your life is being demanded of you. And the things you have prepared, whose will they be?' ²¹ So it is with those who store up treasures for themselves but are not rich toward God."




Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

To you, O God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory in your holy church, now and forever. **Amen**

Lutheran Church of Our Savior: Summer Fun

Go on a journey down the river and explore the 5 gifts of discipleship! These 5 stops along the river are here to help you refresh your commitments made at baptism and connect in a different way to your faith over the summer months.

How to Play: Write your name on a fish, feel free to decorate it! This will be your "game piece" showing what gift you are working on.

Start your fish on the first gift and spend a week (or 2!) reflecting on that message in your life. Below are suggested actions you could take to more deeply engage with the gift. Feel free to take other similar actions you feel help you connect you to the gift. Pray, talk about and act on it however you feel is best!

Once you have dedicated some time- again a week or 2- move your game piece fish down the river towards the next gift. Continue until you've engaged with all 5 gifts. The game board is public all summer along allowing other congregants to cheer you on, ask for support or help you along your river journey!

- 1. Together: Live among God's faithful people and connect with members of the church
 - a. Visit the homebound or sick
 - b. Introduce yourself to visitors
 - c. Show up to a congregants' special concert, game or performance
- 2. Sharing: Think about how we can share the Word of God and the Lords Supper with the world in need
 - a. Try new practices of prayer
 - b. Create a special worship opportunity
 - c. Do a bible study on the beach or outside
- 3. Proclaim: Extend the good news of God beyond the walls of the church through Word & Deed
 - a. Text or share church events with friends
 - b. Write an opinion piece for the local news
 - c. Post church events on community boards online or in person
- 4. Service: Serve all people following the example of Jesus by volunteering for folks in need
 - a. Sign up for a volunteering event
 - b. Research fellow agencies doing good for those in Patchogue
 - c. Help out at our food pantry
- 5. Justice: Identify an issue of justice or peace that our community needs help with
 - a. Talk to neighbors about concerns they have
 - b. Study the ELCA social statements
 - c. Attend a local village meeting
