IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT RECENT EXPENSES: Please know that due to the extreme cold weather, the church and the parsonage required fuel deliveries that, in a normal winter season, would not have been required until mid to late April and after that the next delivery would not have been until late October or early November. But instead, February fuel expenses were an unexpected \$2,659.87 for the church and \$695.66 for the parsonage. Additionally, due to the heavy snow, we had a snow plowing bill of \$4,870.00. These unexpected expenses totaled \$ 8,225.53. We will need to make up this amount if we are to meet our budget.
